

Safe Passage to Close 4th Street Thrift Store Now Partnering With St. Vincent DePaul

Coeur d'Alene, ID (May 24, 2017) – Safe Passage Violence Prevention Center announced they will be closing their Thrift Store located at 848 N 4th Street in Coeur d'Alene. The organization has determined the store no longer serves an unanswered need in the community and will be shifting focus and resources back to their core programs. They will be holding sales now until the end of June to clear existing merchandise and will no longer be accepting Thrift Store donations.

To continue to provide clothing and household goods to their clients, Safe Passage will now be partnering with St. Vincent De Paul in Coeur d'Alene, who continues to provide excellent thrift store services to our North Idaho community.

“St. Vinny’s is a wonderful partner to us and others in the community and we’re pleased to announce they will honor all Safe Passage vouchers given to our clients,” said Executive Director Katie Coker.

The goal of Safe Passage is to increase safety and empowerment for survivors of sexual or domestic violence, while advocating for change through education and prevention programs. Through this partnership they will still be able to provide immediate clothing needs as well as professional clothing to survivors in transition, children’s clothing and housewares.

“We would like to thank the public for their many years of support and hope that we can continue to receive that support, albeit in a different way,” said Coker.
